Why? According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, reading aloud to babies has a long lasting effect on language and literacy development, and reading skills. Sharing books joyfully makes a difference!





#### **SHARE**

**Snuggle**: If your child likes to snuggle or cuddle, do so while sharing books.

**Hands on**: Let your baby or toddler hold and handle the book. It's fine if your baby chews on the book. They are learning how books work.

**Affection**: Reading in a loving way with your baby or toddler helps build strong relationships and trust. Reading together is **love-**ly.

**Respond to the child** using these STEP activities:

#### **STEP**

- **S-t-r-e-t-c-h word sounds** so your child can hear them more easily. Use "parentese," high pitch voice, speak slowly and clearly.
- Talk about the pictures using lots of words. Don't worry if your child cannot understand all you say.
- Explore word sounds in fun ways—sounds of animals, cars, trains
- Patience helps when your child gets frustrated and goes a long way in helping your child enjoy books. It's fine to stop before the book is done, and share another time.

**Enjoy the process**. Most of all, have fun!
